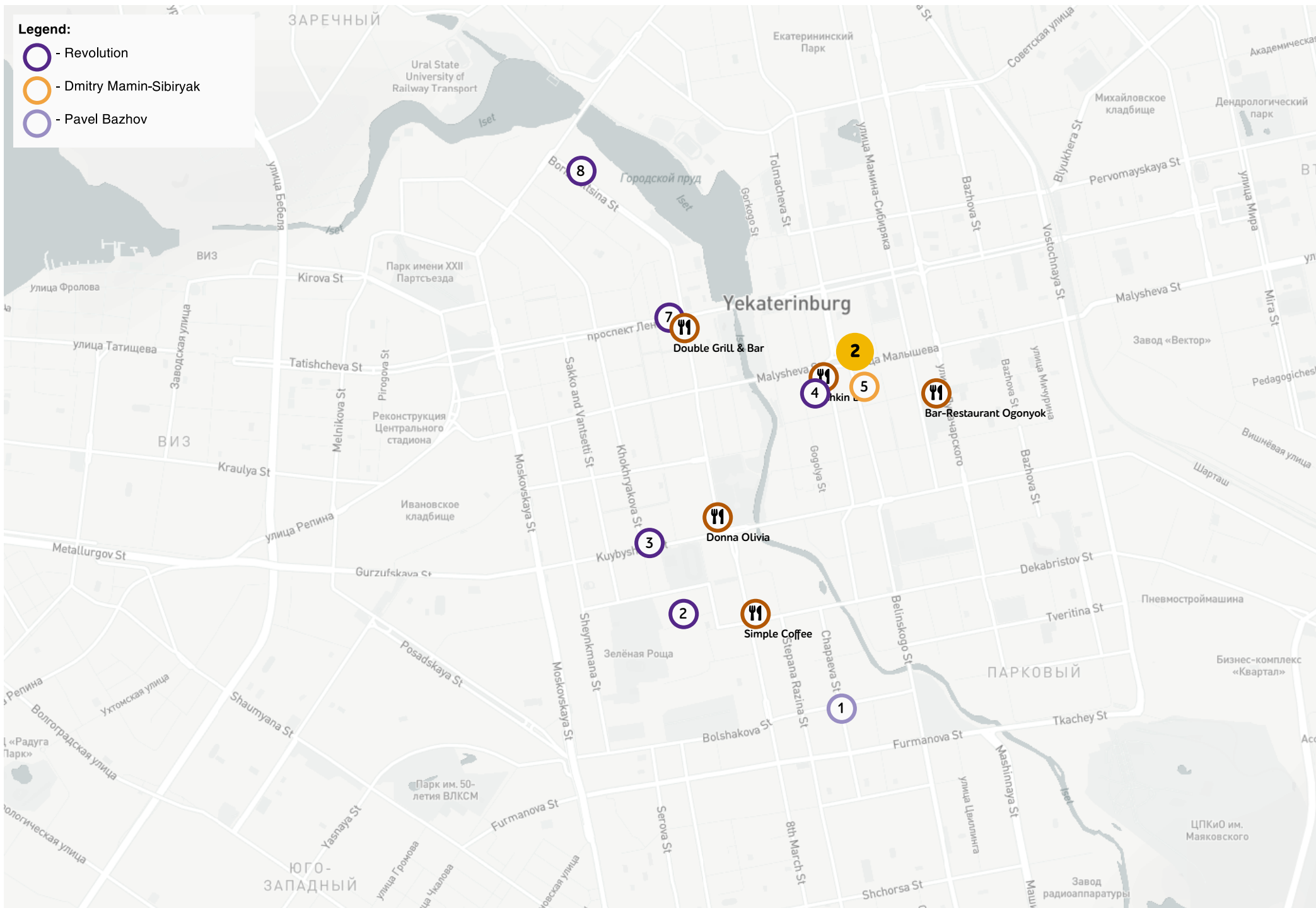

Yekaterinburg

Yekaterinburg was founded on November 18, 1723, named after Russian emperor Peter the Great's wife, Yekaterina, serving as the mining capital of the Russian Empire as well as a strategic connection between Europe and Asia. Yekaterinburg was known as the 'window to Asia', a reference to Saint Petersburg as a 'window to Europe'.

Pavel Petrovich Bazhov (Russian: Пáвел Петро́вич Бажо́в; 27 January 1879 – 3 December 1950) was a Russian writer. Bazhov is best known for his collection of fairy tales The Malachite Box, based on Ural folklore and published in the Soviet Union in 1939. In 1944, the translation of the collection into English was published in New York City and London. Later Sergei Prokofiev created the ballet The Tale of the Stone Flower based on one of the tales.

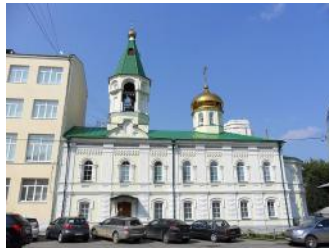
